

South Dakota Universities **Increase Access to Digital Collections through** Collaboration with the **Digital Public Library of America**

The Digital Library of South Dakota (DLSD) has partnered with the Digital Public Library of America (DPLA) to bring over 50,000 items held by South Dakota universities to national audiences. Together, the collections within this digital library consortium offer unique resources, particularly in the areas of regional history and the lives and experiences of generations of South Dakotans.

The DPLA is a non-profit working to increase the discovery of library, archive, and museum collections by aggregating metadata and thumbnails for millions of records from across the nation, DPLA has been growing a network of contributing institutions that bring diverse materials to a large public audience. The cultural institutions participating in DPLA represent the richness and diversity of America itself, from the smallest local history museum to our nation's largest cultural institutions.

A general encyclopedia of music. MGG is encyclopedic in the true sense of the term: it offers in-depth articles on every aspect of music as well as many related areas such as literature, philosophy, and visual arts. MGG Online contains the second print edition of MGG, published from 1994 to 2008 as well as current, continuous online updates and additions.

US Newsstream

Same-day publication access to over 250 news titles, including the Sioux Falls Argus Leader, St. Paul Pioneer Press, and Minneapolis Star Tribune with archives back to circa. 1984 for the NYTIMES, LA TIMES, Chicago Tribune, Washington Post, Boston Globe, Des Moines Register. Provided by the State Library.

Nexis Uni (formerly LexisNexis Academic Universe)

Nexis Uni is a collection of online databases: News, Business (plus corporate news and corporate financials), Legal, Medical, and Reference.

JSTOR Arts & Sciences VIII

The University Libraries has obtained JSTOR Arts & Sciences VIII - Evidence-Based Evaluation through Dec. 31, 2018. A&S VIII broadens coverage of core humanities disciplines; features rare 19th- and early 20th-century American art periodicals from the Frick, the Met, and the Brooklyn Museum; contains noteworthy titles such as Poetry and BOMB. Titles can be found in the library catalog or searching JSTOR.

JoVE Journal of Visualized Experiments

Thanks to additional funding made available by the <u>SD BRIN grant</u>, the University Libraries is able to expand our JoVE coverage.

The University Libraries now has access to all of JoVE except for engineering. The Journal of Visualized Experiments (JoVE) is a peer reviewed, PubMed indexed journal. JoVE publishes experimental techniques in a visual, video format with detailed text protocols to increase scientific reproducibility and productivity. Coverage includes Biology, Biochemistry, Bioengineering, Cancer Research, Chemistry, Developmental Biology, the Environment, Genetics, and Immunology and Infection.



Digital Collections

Horace J. Austin 1887 Diary Transcription

These materials are part of the Horace J. Austin Diaries series. The 1887 diary is a typical daily register, usually recounting specific events, weather and daily.

Horace J. Austin came to Dakota Territory where he gained employment as a land surveyor. In 1863, Austin served as a sergeant in Company A of the First Dakota Cavalry and was elected a Territorial Legislator in the House in 1865.

Mamie Shields Pyle Correspondence

A pioneer leader of the women's suffrage movement in South Dakota. Mamie Shields Pyle became president of the State Equal Suffrage League in 1910, which became the South Dakota Universal Franchise League the following year. Pyle's determination, along with that of her colleagues, allowed the women of South Dakota to claim victory in 1918, when state lawmakers and voters passed the equal suffrage amendment. Pyle also led the campaign for state ratification of the national suffrage amendment, which occurred on 4 December 1919.
