The University Libraries now has access to all of JoVE except for Engineering. The Journal of Visualized Experiments (JoVE) is a peer reviewed, PubMed indexed video methods journal. JoVE publishes experimental techniques in a visual, video format with detailed text protocols to increase scientific reproducibility and productivity. Coverage includes Phycology, Physics, Biology, Biochemistry, Bioengineering, Cancer Research, Chemistry, Developmental Biology, the Environment, Genetics, and Immunology and Infection.

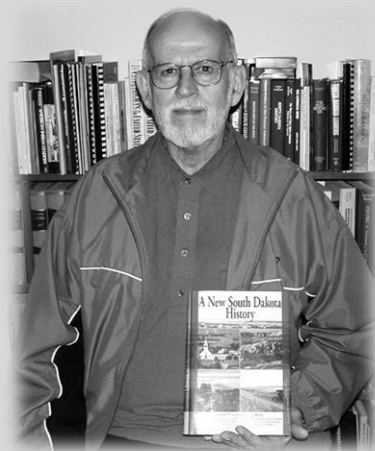
Elgaronline

Vermillion and Vicinity

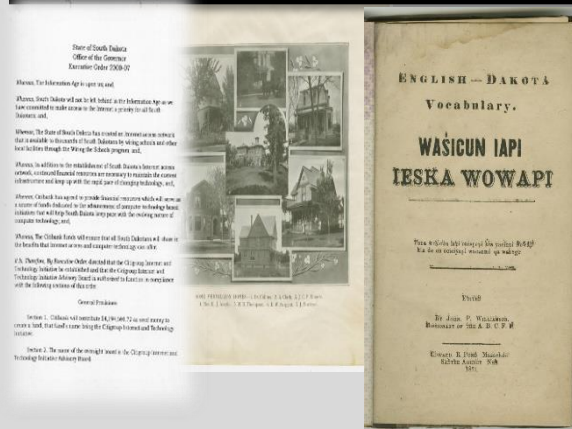

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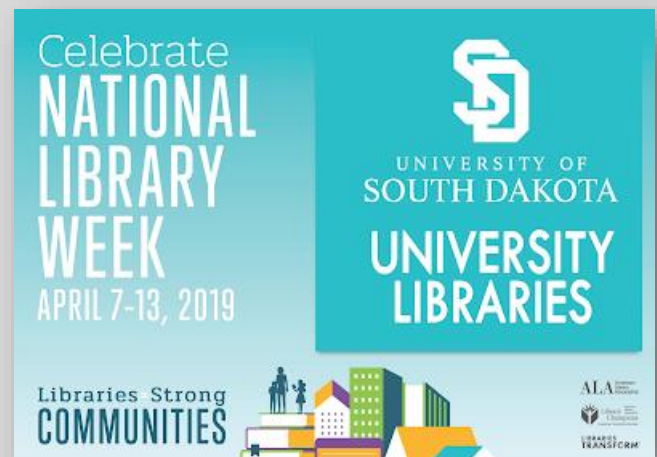
